Unison Thames Branch are asking our members to join the National Unison campaign to have a Unison safety rep on every floor in every office, at every depot, in every lab and in every other building we work from.

We aim to raise awareness of health and safety issues at work and use our health and safety activists to campaign to improve working conditions for all.

The words Health and Safety may conjure up visions of clipboards, regulations and paperwork, but it's really not like that.

Being a Safety rep means you will be playing a crucial role in making sure your workplace is safe, secure and clean for all your colleagues and service users.

You'll also gain new skills through the excellent Unison learning program which hopes to return to face to face courses as well as online learning in 2022, all expenses paid by the branch and time off to attend approved by the Environment Agency.
